Then back to Manila to speak at the 31st anniversary of the church in Mandaluyong and teach a missions class for the next 5 nights.

Malabon, Metro Manila



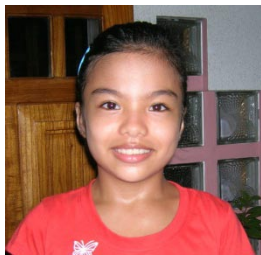
Last year we helped Andrew (age 20) go back to school. He completed 3rd yr. high school with good grades and a huge improvement in his writing skills. He is postponing his senior year because his father is sick and he needs to help his mother in their junk shop.



Marjorie (age 7) is waiting for the second surgery to close up the bone where they removed the tumor from her face. She is excited to go to 1st grade. Her mom died and her father abandoned her so she lives with her grandparents. Last Oct. we bought foundation wood for their 'house' that had partially collapsed after the flood. When we visited them at their new location, the walls were tarps so we gave their church money to buy plywood for walls and the tarps are now used for the bath area.

Zamboanga, Mindanao

Every year we have been helping the widow, Mhey Loreto, with school expenses. Her husband, Dennis, passed away a few yrs. ago at age 30.
